A Regular Meeting of the Lexington City Council was held Tuesday, May 28, 2002, at the Lexington Municipal Building, located at 406 E. 7<sup>th</sup> Street, Lexington, Nebraska at 7:30 p.m. Members of the Council present were Mayor John Fagot, Ted Cook, Rick Klamm, John Salem, Steve Tomasek. City Officials present were City Manager Joe Peplitsch, City Attorney Willard Weinhold, Deputy City Clerk Shirley Lewis.

Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to the Mayor and all members of the Council, and a copy of their Acknowledgement of Receipt of Notice and the Agenda is attached to these Minutes. Availability of the Agenda was communicated in advance notice and in the notice to the Mayor and Council of this Meeting. The proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. All items presented and discussed on the Agenda were available for public inspection.

Pepplitsch informed the City Council that Rob Waterman has resigned his positions on the Planning Commission, and the Community Redevelopment Authority. It was requested that Council consider a replacement on the Planning Commission, and Administration will consider a replacement on the CRA.

Pepplitsch presented the City Council with a letter from Dan and Sue Cunningham, requesting their property be removed from the Corporate Limits. Following discussion, Council directed Administration to send a letter responding to their request.

Councilman John Salem requested a tour be arranged for the Council Members, of the Wastewater Treatment Plant.
