


## Earth Day is a global event.

# Earth Day is celebrated worldwide in over 192 countries.




The purpose is to show global support for the protection of our environment.

# Why was Earth Day started?



In the late 1960's and into 1970, most Americans paid little attention to the damage being done to our environment.








Most Americans drove very large cars that got very poor gas mileage. Not only were petroleum products being used excessively, but automobile emissions were polluting the air.





Earth Day 1970 was organized to promote awareness for our environment, and to encourage all people to take better care of the environment.







Gaylord Nelson, a US Senator from Wisconsin, proposed and organized the first Earth Day in 1970. As a result, on April 20, 1970, 20 million Americans took up the environmental cause and protested.









Thousands of schools, colleges and universities participated in the first Earth Day. The participants led peaceful demonstrations in favor of environmental reform.

The first Earth Day led to the creation of the United States Environmental Protection Agency and the passage of the Clean Air, Clean Water, and Endangered Species Acts.

countries












The Earth Day
