ORDINANCE NO. 229

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO NORTHWESTERN BELL TELEPHONE COMPANY, A CORPORATION, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT TO USE AND OCCUPY THE STREETS, ALLEYS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING, MAINTAINING AND OPERATING A GENERAL TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH SYSTEM WITHIN SAID CITY.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska:

Section 1. That Northwestern Bell Telephone Company, a corporation, its successors and assigns, are hereby granted the right to use and occupy the streets, alleys, and other public places of the city of Lexington, Nebraska, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating a general telephone and telegraph system within said city.

Section 2. That the rights herein granted are subject to the exercise of the police power as the same now is or may hereafter be conferred upon said city.

Section 3. That Northwestern Bell Telephone Company shall, upon demand, pay the cost of publishing this ordinance.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect, and shall constitute a binding contract between the City of Lexington and Northwestern Bell Telephone Company when it shall have been enacted and published according to law, and when the provisions hereof shall have been accepted in writing by said Northwestern Bell Telephone Company, and such acceptance filed with the City Clerk.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska:

Section 1. That North eastern Bell Telephone Company, a corporation, its successors and assigns, ar hereby granted the right to use and occupy the streets, alleys and other public places of the city of Lexington, Nebraska, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating a general telephone and telegraph system within said city.

Section 2. That the rights herein granted are subject to the exercise of the police power as the same now is or may hereafter be conferred upon said City.

Section 3. That Northwestern Bell Telephone Company shall, upon demand, pay the cost of publishing this ordinance.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect, and shall constitute a binding contract between the City of Lexington and Northwestern Bell Telephone Company when it shall have been enacted and published according to law, and when the provisions hereof shall have been accepted in writing by said Northwestern Bell Telephone Company, and such acceptance filed with the City Clerk.
