This ordinance was introduced by Conncilman Spies and is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 314

ANNUAL LEVY ORDINANCE.

An ordinance making a levy for taxation on all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, for the fiscal year 1936, commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1936.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That there is hereby levied on all or the taxable property within the corporate limits or the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, for the fiscal year 1956, commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1936, the following:
