

ORDINANCE RECORD

CITY HALL LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA

The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, met in regular special session in the City Hall at 8:00 o'clock P. M., on February 9, 1937 Mayor Kjar presided and City Clerk Olsson recorded the proceedings of this meeting.

The Mayor instructed the Clerk to call the roll. The Clerk called the roll and the following Councilmen were present: Gillan, Morganson, Hagadone, Spies, Barrett, Evans.

Absent: none.

Whereupon the Mayor announced that the introduction of ordinances was now in order, and the matter now coming before the Mayor and Council was the passage and approval of Ordinance No. 322 of the City of Lexington, Nebraska.

This ordinance was introduced by Councilman Hagadone and is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 322.

An Ordinance to prohibit motor vehicles, or vehicles of any kind, from driving over fire hose of said City while the same is being used within said City, and to provide a penalty for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska:

Section 1. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person or persons to drive or permit to be driven, any motor vehicle, or vehicle of any kind, over or across any of the fire hose owned by said City or being used by the firemen of said City, on any street, alley or other place within said City.

Section 2. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, on conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00, for each offense, together with all costs of prosecution, and shall be committed to jail until such fine and costs are fully paid.

Section 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
