## CITY HALL LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA

The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, met in regular Mayor in the City Hall at 8.00 o'clock P. M., on June 1, 1937. Mayor Kjar presided and City Clerk Olsson recorded

the proceedings of this meeting.

The Mayor instructed the Clerk to call the roll. The Clerk called the roll and the following Councilmen were present: Gillan, Morganson, Morgan, Barrett, Evans.

Absent: Councilman Hagadone.

Whereupon the Mayor announced that the introduction of ordinances was now in order, and the matter now coming before the Mayor and Council was the passage and approval of Ordinance No. 329 of the City of Lexington, Nebraska.

This ordinance was introduced by Councilman Gillan and is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

## ORDINANCE NO. 329

An Ordinance to amend Section 4 of Ordinance No. 307 which was passed and approved by the City Council of Lexington, Nebraska, on July 5, 1935, as amended by Ordinance No. 311 which was passed and approved March 10, 1936.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA:

SECTION 1. That Section 4 of Ordinance No. 307 which was passed and approved by the Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, on July 5, 1935, as amended by Ordinance No. 311 which was passed and approved on March 10, 1936, shall be amended to read as follows:

"Section 4. No person shall, within such City, sell at retail any alcoholic liquor, including beer, on the day of any national, state, county or municipal election, including primary election, during the hours the polls are open in said City. No person shall, within such City, sell at retail any alcoholic liquor, including beer, on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell, alcoholic liquor, including beer, within such City on secular days during the months of October to the following May inclusive of each year, between the hours of 10 o'clock P. M. and 6 o'clock A. M. Provided, however, that on Saturday during such months, such liquors, including beer, may be sold until the hour of 11 o'clock P. M. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell alcoholic liquor, including beer, within such City on secular days during the months of June to September inclusive in each year, between the hours of 11 o'clock P. M. to 6 o'clock A. M. Provided, however, that on Saturday during the months of June to September inclusive such liquors, including beer, within such City on secular days during the months of June to September inclusive in each year, between the hours of 11 o'clock P. SECTION 2. That Section 4 of Ordinance No. 307 of said City, as amended by Ordinance No. 311 is hereby repealed.
