The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, met in regular special session in the City Hall at 8.00 o'clock P. M., on July 5, 1938
Mayor Kjar presided and
City Clerk Olsson recorded
the proceedings of this meeting.

The Mayor instructed the Clerk to call the roll. The Clerk called the roll and the following Councilmen were present: Gillan, Morganson, Seaman, Morgan, Barrett, Evans.

Absent: none.

Whereupon the Mayor announced that the introduction of ordinances was now in order, and the matter now coming before the Mayor and Council was the passage and approval of Ordinance No. 339 of the City of Lexington, Nebraska.

This ordinance was introduced by Councilman Evans and is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 339

ANNUAL LEVY ORDINANCE.

An ordinance making a levy for taxation on all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the city of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, for the fiscal year 1938, commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1938.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That there is hereby levied on all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, for the fiscal year 1938, commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1938, the following:
