## CITY HALL LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA

The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, met in regular special session in the City Hall at 8 o'clock P.M., on October 9, 1945 Mayor Cook presided and City Clerk W.R. Eesenberger recorded the proceedings of this meeting.

The Mayor instructed the Clerk to call the roll. The Clerk called the roll and the following Councilmen were present: Reynolds, Morganson, Hebrew, Hemelstrand and Reutlinger.

Absent: Smith

Whereupon the Mayor announced that the introduction of ordinances was now in order, and the matter now coming before the Mayor and Council was the passage and approval of Ordinance No. 406 of the City of Lexington, Nebraska.

This ordinance was introduced by Councilman Reynolds and is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

### ORDINANCE NO. 406

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 2 OF ARTICLE 1 OF CHAPTER 10 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA, WHICH WAS PASSED AND APPROVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA ON BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR APRIL 7, 1943. AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA:

SECTION 1. That Section 2 of Article I of Chapter 10 of the Municipal Code of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, which was passed and approved by the Mayor and Council of said City on the 7th day of April, 1943, shall be amended to read as follows:

"SECTION 2. WHERE LAID

That all sidewalks outside of the business district of said City shall be laid two(2) feet from the lot line, and the space between the lot line and the sidewalk shall be graded up to the level of the sidewalk."

SECTION 2. That Section 2 of said Article I of Chapter 10 of the Municipal Code of the City of Lexington, Nebraska, is hereby repealed.

PASSED AND APPROVED this 9th day of October, 1945.
