CITY HALL LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA

The Mayor and Council of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, met in regular special session in the City Hall at 8:00 o'clock P M., on July 2, 1946. Mayor W.A. Stewart presided and City Clerk A.R. Kirkpatrick recorded the proceedings of this meeting.

The Mayor instructed the Clerk to call the roll. The Clerk called the roll and the following Councilmen were present: Smith, Morgansen, Hemelstrand, Hebrew, Reutlinger

Absent: McGuire

Whereupon the Mayor announced that the introduction of ordinances was now in order, and the matter now coming before the Mayor and Council was the passage and approval of Ordinance No. 422 of the City of Lexington, Nebraska.

This ordinance was introduced by Councilman W.R. Smith and is in words and figures as follows, to wit:

ORDINANCE NO. 422 ANNUAL LEVY ORDINANCE

An Ordinance making a levy for taxation on all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, for the fiscal year 1946, commencing on the first Tuesday in May, 1946.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That there is hereby levied on all of the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, for the fiscal year 1946, the following:
