ORDINANCE NO. 450

An Ordinance to amend Sections 1 and 2 of Ordinance No. 383 which was passed and approved on August 3, 1943, as amended by Ordinance No. 437, which was passed and approved on the 6th day of May, 1947, to regulate the production, transportation, processing, handling, sampling, examination, grading, labeling, regrading, and sale of milk and milk products; the inspecting of dairy herds, dairies and milk plants; the issuing and revocation of permits to milk producers and distributors; the placing of restaurants and other establishments serving milk and milk products; and providing penalties for violation of the provisions of said Ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL of the City of
Kexington, Nebraska:

Section 1. That Section 1 of original Ordinance No. 383, as amended by Section 1 Ordinance No. 437 be amended to read as follows:
"Section 1. The production, transportation, processing, handling,

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sampling, examination, grading, labeling, recording and sale of all milk and milk products sold for ultimate consumption within the City of Lexington, Nebraska, or its police jurisdiction, the inspection of dairy herds, dairies and milk plants, the issuing and revocation of permits to producers and distributors, the placarding of restaurants and other establishments serving milk and milk products providing for the collection of fees, and the providing of penalties for the violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be regulated in accordance with the terms of the unbridged form of the 1939 edition of the United States Public Health Service Milk Ordinance, three (3) copies of which shall be on file in the office of the City Clerk; Provided, that the blank spaces following the words "City of" in said unbridged form shall be understood to refer to the City of Lexington, Nebraska; Provided further, that Section 8, 16, and 17, of said unbridged form shall be replaced respectively by Sections 2, 3, and 4 of said original Ordinance No. 383, as amended."

Section 2. That Section 2 of original Ordinance No. 383, as amended by Section 2 of Ordinance No. 437 be amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. From and after ten (10) days from date on which this Ordinance takes effect, no milk or milk products shall be sold to the final consumer, or to restaurants, soda fountains, grocery stores, or similar establishments except Grade A; Provided, that when any milk distributor fails to qualify for the above grade the Health Officer is authorized to revoke his permit or in lieu thereof to degrade his products for at least seven (7) days and permit its sale during a temporary period not exceeding thirty (30) days or in emergencies, for such longer period as he may deem necessary."

Section 3. Said original Sections 1 and 2 of Ordinance No. 437 are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and shall become effective immediately after its passage and approval as required by law.
