

ORDINANCE NO. 984

AN ORDINANCE CREATING IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 100
AND PROVIDING FOR CURB, GUTTER, GRAVEL AND GRADING THEREIN.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL AND THE
COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, DAWSON COUNTY, NEBRASKA.

SECTION 1. That there is hereby created within the City
an Improvement District to be known as "IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT
NO. 100 "


SECTION 2. That the said Improvement District shall
consist of that portion of Cedar Street from Washington
Street to Adams Street; that portion of High Street from
Madison Street to Adams Street; that portion of Madison Street
from Cedar Street to Oak Street; that portion of Taylor Street
from High Street to Cedar Street; and that portion of Adams
Street from High Street to Maple Street; and the property
abutting and adjacent thereto and benefited thereby, as by
law provided.

SECTION 3. That there shall be constructed and provided
on that portion of Cedar Street from Washington Street to Adams
Street; that portion of High Street from Madison Street to
Adams Street; that portion of Madison Street from Cedar Street
to Oak Street; that portion of Taylor Street from High Street
to Cedar Street; and that portion of Adams Street from High
Street to Maple Street; curb, gutter, gravel and grading as
needed, and that the curb, gutter, gravel and grading shall
be in accordance with plans, specifications and estimates to
be hereafter adopted.

SECTION 4. That the streets provided in the above sec-
tion will abut on concrete paving or curb and gutter already
laid.

SECTION 5. That the cost of such curb, gutter, gravel and grading except street and alley intersections, shall be assessed against the lots and tracts of land abutting upon and adjacent to the said portion of streets, specifically benefited thereby, in proportion to the benefits received, to be determined by the City Council as by law provided.
