RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska has been advised that the Civil Aeronautics Administration is considering the decommissioning of C.A.A. facilities located at the Lexington Municipal Airport, and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes that said facilities furnish, to air traffic in general and to this area in particular, many valuable and important services, to wit:

- More than fourteen locally based aircraft use the radio services of the local station daily. Many of these aircraft have purchased and installed radio because of the presence of the local station.
- 2. The local station services a daily average of ten privately owned planes in transit through the area in addition to the many services rendered airline and military aircraft.
- 3. Flying weather information is issued almost daily to a great many home-based planes in the large ranching area to the north of Lexington where detailed information is not otherwise available.
- 4. The local station supplies invaluable weather information, on request, to highway patrol and highway maintenance crews, construction operations, crop seeders and dusters, etc.
- 5. The station has on many occasions been used to establish liason for air-ground ambulance service and during the freakish bad weather that seems to occur frequently in this immediate area, has been an important link in the chain for search and location of downed or lost aircraft.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the President of the Council and the Council of the City of Lexington, Dawson County, Nebraska, that in view of the foregoing many valuable services performed by the local station of the C.A.A., that the Civil Aeronautics Administration be, and hereby are, respectfully requested to seriously and thoroughly consider all the needs of this area before the local C.A.A. station is officially decommissioned.
